What is the role of a SMVF Navigator?

The SMVF Navigator fosters community partnerships to provide comprehensive support to Veterans, active service members, and their families, aiming to boost care coordination, ease logistical and financial burdens, while also empowering local providers to meet Veteran needs. Key tasks involve enhancing resource access, determining support eligibility, and coordinating with the VA and other agencies to ensure universal access for Veterans.

Suicide Prevention

- The Veterans Crisis Line provides free and confidential support through calls, chats, or texts. Qualified responders trained in crisis intervention and military culture are available to listen and assist veterans, service members, and their families.
